Upskilling and Refresher Training for Village Health Care Assistants (VHA's)

A 4-day upskilling and refresher training for Western Highlands Village Healthcare Assistants (VHAs) was held at the Mt Hagen General Hospital on the 23rd -24th April 2024

WHPHA has a total of 204 VHAs, 126 active. These VHA's play a pivotal role in communities assisting health workers.

Their role in communities is to make awareness and deliver health education messages to pregnant mothers and other social groups within the community. All in all, they are the voices of health workers in communities.

Over the years, WHPHA has recognized the importance of their work through data and statistics collected and presented. Therefore, the upskilling training is conducted to improve the skills and knowledge of the VHA's.

Influx of Patients at the Emergency Department an Ongoing Concern.

Mt Hagen General Hospital is under huge pressure stretching all its resources to treat the influx of patients, Says Western Highlands Provincial Health Authority Acting CEO Jane Holden.

Hospital medical staff are working three shifts a day to treat the influx of patients.

Hospital Manager Serah Dot added on stating that the hospital has 303 which is not enough to cater for the influx. Hence resulting in patients getting treated on the floor.

"We are stretching every resource we have to address the increasing number of sick people," Dot said.

Holden further stated that the many people from the upper Highlands Provinces tend to seek medical services here and that is one reason why the hospital sees an increase in the number of patients treated daily.

"Another reason is because our district hospitals do not provide level four health services," says Holden.

Emergency physician Dr. John McKup Jnr supported these statements stating the Emergency Department is the first place in the hospital that faces this situation daily.

Meanwhile, the Hospital Management and the PHA are working on some solutions like increasing medical staff, upgrading the emergency department and improve health services in the districts.

Facts about HPV

What is HPV?

- HPV is a very common virus, and it spreads easily through skin-to-skin contact.
- Most people will have an HPV infection in their lives.
- HPV infection usually has no symptoms and is cleared naturally by the body.
- If not cleared from the body, persistent HPV infection causes cervical cancer.
- There is no cure for HPV infection, but you can prevent it from happening

Is the HPV vaccine safe?

It sure is. The vaccine is very safe. It is used in more than 125 countries. Vaccines must pass strict safety testing before gaining WHO and NDoH approval. The vaccine is non-infectious and cannot cause disease or infertility because it does not contain live virus, DNA from the virus, or toxins.

Is the HPV vaccine free?

Yes, it is free for girls aged 9 to 14 years. Who should have the HPV vaccine? All girls aged 9 to 14 years.

Where can I get the HPV vaccine for my girl?

Girls aged 9 to 14 will be offered the HPV vaccine at schools as a free service run by the WHPHA in collaboration with the Department of Education and the Western Highlands Provincial Government. You can also get the HPV vaccine at a health clinic or Mt Hagen General Hospital, and during outreach immunisation sessions.

How many doses of the vaccine are needed?

Girls will only need one dose of the HPV vaccine. Some girls with lower immunity may need more doses.

What if my daughter missed out on the HPV vaccine?

If your child missed the vaccination when it was given at her school, you can catch up for free at a health clinic or the Mt Hagen General Hospital and during outreach immunisation visits.

Why is the HPV vaccine recommended for young girls?

It is very important to vaccinate girls. The vaccine produces a better immune response against HPV infection when younger than at an older age.

What else do I need to do?

Talk to your girl about the HPV vaccine and how important it is to prevent cervical cancer. Make sure your girl is vaccinated when the HPV vaccination day is scheduled at your school or at a school near you. Or go to your closest health clinic or Mt Hagen General Hospital.

Western Highlands Provincial Health Authority (WHPHA) Board, after thorough deliberation, the board has accepted the Interviewing Panel's conclusion that none of the candidates interviewed are suitable for the Chief Executive Officer role at this time. We will re-advertise the position immediately.

To ensure seamless business continuity, the Board has extended Ms. Jane Holden's appointment as Acting CEO. Her Head of Department status will be automatically renewed every three months until a permanent CEO is appointed.

The Board has full confidence in Ms. Holden's leadership. While it is disappointing that we have not yet found a permanent CEO, we have encountered some promising candidates. The Board understands the critical importance of this appointment, as PHAs are complex organisations that deliver essential services.

WHPHA faces numerous challenges, and we seek a leader with management experience, discipline, and commitment to address these challenges cohesively. Unfortunately, the current pool of applicants did not meet the Board's expectations.

We remain OFFICE OF THE BOARD CHAIRMAN Our Vision – "A Healthy Western Highlands Province" dedicated to finding the right individual to guide WHPHA through this pivotal time.

Appointment Dr. Ripa to the Board of WHPHA.

I am also pleased to announce that the Board, having considered the absence of a medical professional, appointed Dr Paulus Ripa as a co-opted Board member, effective immediately following his retirement from the Provincial Health Authority at the end of June 2024.

This decision is consistent with section 18(1)(e) of the Provincial Health Authority Act 2007. Dr. Ripa brings a wealth of medical expertise and experience to our Board, and we are confident that his insights will significantly enhance our governance and strategic direction.

Due to the ongoing maintenance that will be undertaken in ED and also the increased number of patients coming into the ED we will be scaling down to accept only referrals from within WHP district healthy facilities. No inter-provincial referrals unless through the office of DMS/CEO.

We hope to start on the 1st July 2024

Once the ED ambulatory clinic room is ready we will then look at reverting back to seeing non-referrals as well.

This will not affect Emergency Cat 1 and 2 cases which will be progressed through via ED triage. However, all Cat 3 without referrals were sent back to the nearest Health facility
